

What does the Club offer?

Library: Members have access to our extensive library of books, magazines and patterns etc. on the subject of dolls, teddies, fashions, patterns etc. A small fee is charged when borrowing.

Magazine : All members receive a copy of our quarterly magazine which contains articles, diary events and advertisements relating to doll collecting.

Fair: An annual fair is held to raise funds for a chosen charity for that year.

Speakers: Whenever possible a speaker is invited to share their knowledge and enthusiasm on their particular subject of interest.

Club Sales: Each meeting provides a Club table for members to sell their unwanted dolls etc. A fee of 10% of realised price is payable to the Club.

Paddy's Market: Held periodically at meetings where members may hire a table to sell any items.

Doll of the month: At each meeting, attending members may bring a doll, in a predetermined category to share and talk about if they wish.

Show and Tell: Members are encouraged to bring along their newly acquired dolls, unidentified dolls, or other items of interest to share with other members.

Auctions: Members can arrange for their doll related items to be auctioned at meetings, by providing prior notice to the President. A 10% fee of the realised price is payable to the Club.

Charity auctions are held periodically, where items are donated by members and proceeds are given to the charity for that year.

“Plangon” was an ancient Greek word originating in the days when women were not permitted to act on stage, and a waxen figure (“a plangon”) was used. This eventually evolved to mean a smaller humanoid figure (dolls and playthings).
